A row of server racks populated with access switches typically represents an End-of-Row (EoR) or centralized switching architecture, where all servers in the row connect to these switches via structured cabling.

Overview of the Setup

When a row of server racks is full of access switches, it usually indicates a centralized network design. In this configuration, each server in the row connects to the access switches using structured cabling, which can be copper (Cat5e, Cat6, or Cat6A) or fiber optics. The access switches aggregate traffic from all servers in the row and then uplink to higher-level aggregation or core switches, often using high-speed optical interfaces such as 40G, 100G, or 400G .

Advantages

- **Centralized Management:** All switches for the row are in one location, simplifying maintenance, configuration, and monitoring .
- **Reduced Hardware Costs:** Fewer switches are needed compared to Top-of-Rack (ToR) deployments, lowering capital expenditure and spare parts inventory .
- **Cleaner Cabling:** Structured cabling to a single row-end location reduces clutter inside individual racks .
- **Lower Power Consumption per Rack:** No need to power a switch in every server cabinet
