

Core Switch Qualification Requirements Standards

A core switch must meet high-performance, reliability, and redundancy standards, including Layer 3 capabilities, high forwarding rates, low latency, and robust security features.

Performance and Throughput

Core switches are expected to handle high-speed data forwarding and support the backbone of an enterprise network. They must provide wire-speed forwarding using dedicated ASICs and support port speeds ranging from 10G to 400G+ Ethernet. The forwarding rate should be calculated based on the number of connected devices and traffic patterns, ensuring the switch can manage peak loads without bottlenecks. For Layer 3 switches, both backplane bandwidth and forwarding rate must meet or exceed minimum standards to qualify for core deployment .

Redundancy and Reliability

Redundancy is critical for core switches to maintain network stability. Qualified core switches typically include:

- Dual, hot-swappable power supplies
- Redundant control modules
- Redundant cooling systems
- Routing redundancy via protocols like HSRP or VRRP These features ensure contin...
