Overview

Fiber optic is not impacted by the proximity with the power cable. On the other hand, when fibre is run with a transmission line with towers, it may be prudent to use the same spacing as for grounded parts. Separating high-voltage power cables from low-voltage communication cables is a fundamental requirement in any electrical installation. This practice is mandatory for two distinct reasons: ensuring the safety of the structure and its occupants, and preserving the integrity of sensitive data. Maintaining proper separation between power, data, and limited energy cabling is foundational to system performance, safety, and code compliance.
