

Distance requirements for high and low voltage cable trays



Article Overview

High-voltage and low-voltage cable trays must be separated to prevent electrical hazards and electromagnetic interference, with typical minimum horizontal spacing of 0.5 meters and vertical spacing of 150 mm, adjustable with shielding.

NEC and Safety Requirements

The National Electrical Code (NEC 2026) mandates separation between high-voltage power cables and low-voltage communication or limited energy cables to ensure safety and signal integrity. Parallel runs of power and communication cables require a minimum separation of 2 inches (50 mm) according to NEC Article 800.133(A)(1)(c), primarily to reduce inductive coupling and prevent accidental contact. When cables cross, they should do so perpendicularly, which allows the minimum separation to be relaxed. For Class 2/3 circuits, NEC 725.136 prohibits sharing space with Class 1 circuits unless installed using Class 1 wiring methods.

Horizontal and Vertical Tray Spacing

For installations using separate cable trays, the recommended horizontal spacing between power and signal trays is generally 0.5 meters, which can be reduced to 0.3 meters if trays are shielded to contain EMI. When installing two trays in parallel at the same height, a minimum distance of 0.6 meters is advised to allow maintenance access, inspection, and proper airflow for heat dissipation. Vertical spacing between floor-mounted trays should be at least 150 mm to prevent obstruction and maintain...
