

Does a switch have two fiber optic cores one for the left and one for the right



Overview

Short answer: Usually yes, you use them in pairs, but the “pair” can be a media converter on one end and a fiber switch (or SFP in a switch) on the other, as long as both sides speak the same speed, wavelength, and optical mode. The number of optical cores in an optical fiber is the total number of equipment interfaces multiplied by 2, plus 10% to 20% of the spare quantity, and if the communication mode of the equipment has serial communication and equipment multiplexing, you can reduce the number of cores. In real networks such as campuses, factories, metro POPs converters let you reuse existing switches and still run fiber for long distance, EMI immunity. Each link between switches will require two fibers (cores), one for transmit (Tx) and one for receive (Rx); two links would require 4 fibers (cores); unless WDM is used (another story). For Gigabit Ethernet links. Other than entry level network switches, most of today's network switches include one or more GiBC (Gigabit Converter) or SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) slots.
