Combining them without precautions can lead to safety hazards and interference.

Electromagnetic Interference (EMI): High-voltage cables can induce voltages in nearby low-voltage circuits, causing signal degradation, cross-talk, or equipment malfunction . Proper separation or shielding is essential to maintain system reliability.

Physical Separation: Industry best practices recommend using dividers or compartmentalized trays to maintain a minimum gap (commonly around 30 cm) between high-voltage and low-voltage cables . This reduces the risk of electrical interference and enhances safety.

Shielding and Grounding: Low-voltage cables should be shielded and properly grounded if they share a tray with high-voltage cables. Shielding helps mitigate EMI but does not replace the need for physical separation .

Code Compliance: Electrical codes such as NEC 2026 and TIA-569-E specify separation rules for power and limited-energy circuits. Violating these rules can result in inspection failures, safety hazards, and long-term reliability issues . Always follow local regulations, manufacturer recommendations, and project specifications.
