

How many meters of fiber optic cable connector should be left



Article Overview

Typically, 10 meters of fiber optic cable should be reserved at each connector or joint point, with up to 20 meters reserved at major handholes for maintenance and future adjustments.

Standard Practices for Cable Reservation

When installing fiber optic cables, it is essential to leave sufficient slack to facilitate maintenance, splicing, and connectorization. The general recommendations are:

- Handholes and communication pipelines: Leave 10 meters of cable per side at standard handholes to allow for handling and future adjustments. For every handhole that is a multiple of 5, 10, or 15, it is common to reserve 20 meters to accommodate larger maintenance needs and potential re-routing .
- Joint points: Each joint or splice point should have 10 meters of cable left on the adjacent pole or within the joint enclosure to ensure proper access and reduce stress on the fiber .
- Pigtail terminations: For short patch cords or pigtails, lengths are typically 1-3 meters, which is sufficient for fusion splicing or connector attachment without affecting system performance .
