Overview

In (A-B) polarity, the transmit signal on one end (fiber A) aligns with the receive signal on the opposite end (fiber B). This straight-through connection allows data to flow seamlessly between devices, and A-B polarity is generally achieved with standard A-B duplex patch cords. The three methods defined by the TIA 568 standard to ensure the correct polarity of optical fibers are named Method A, Method B, and Method C. Since fiber optic links require a two-way - or duplex - connection, there is potential for errors in installation by connecting transmitter to transmitter or.
