According to the CORE's model, you should configure the two CORE as ONE CORE by using vPC, Stackwise or VSS technologies. In the event that one link fails, the secondary (or tertiary) link can take over, maintaining network uptime. This redundancy can be applied at various levels, including WAN connections.
