Testing After Installation: After each installation, inspect the splice visually and test with an optical power meter or visual fault locator. This ensures that repeated installations have not introduced excessive loss or misalignment (). 5. Connector Longevity: Repeated mechanical stress can degrade the connector's internal components. If a connector is repeatedly installed and removed, consider replacing it after several cycles to maintain performance (). 6.
