Core Layer: The core layer is the backbone of the hierarchy network. The primary transmission and routing of data signals take place at the core layer only. The devices like high-capacity transmitters are placed in this. The switching engine is the core component of the switch, responsible for data forwarding and routing. It processes data packets from various ports and forwards them to the correct output ports based on destination address information. Engineered to aggregate massive volumes of data from distribution switches, it provides ultra-low latency and maximum throughput to ensure uninterrupted routing and packet.
