

What is the quota for plugging holes in cable trays



Article Overview

When plugging holes in cable trays, maintain the tray fill at or below 50% of the tray's rated capacity to ensure compliance with NEC 392 and proper heat dissipation.

Key Guidelines

NEC Article 392 governs cable tray installations, including fill limits, grounding, and fire safety measures . The allowable fill depends on the tray type:

- Ladder Tray: Offers the best ventilation; fill limits are higher due to free airflow around cables .
- Ventilated Trough Tray: Moderate ventilation; fill limits are slightly lower than ladder trays .
- Solid-Bottom Tray: Minimal ventilation; fill limits are most restrictive because trapped heat reduces ampacity .

Practical Quota for Plugging Holes

When plugging holes in cable trays (e.g., for firestopping or sealing unused openings):

- Do not exceed 50% of the tray's rated fill for the section being modified. This ensures adequate airflow and prevents overheating .
- Use manufacturer-approved plugs or covers that maintain structural integrity and comply with firestop requirements
