

What is the spacing between vertical cable trays



Article Overview

The minimum recommended vertical spacing between floor-mounted cable trays is generally 150 millimeters (6 inches), with at least 12 inches (300 mm) of clearance above trays for maintenance access.

Recommended Vertical Clearance

For standard installations, floor-mounted cable trays should have a minimum vertical spacing of 150 millimeters (6 inches) to prevent obstruction, allow ventilation, and facilitate future cable additions . In addition, the 2026 NEC update specifies at least 12 inches (300 mm) of vertical clearance above trays to provide safe access for installation and maintenance . This ensures that technicians can inspect, repair, or replace cables without interference and helps maintain proper airflow for heat dissipation.

Considerations for Long Vertical Runs

For vertical runs exceeding 32 meters, strain relief sections should be incorporated to prevent undue mechanical stress on the cables . In very long vertical runs (over 100 meters), it is recommended to include short horizontal offsets of at least 1 meter to relieve tension and avoid straight vertical stress on the cables . Cables should also be fastened to the tray's transverse members to maintain stability and prevent sagging .
