

What wavelength of light does the fiber optic module emit

That value determines whether the module is designed for multimode fiber (MMF) or single-mode fiber (SMF), how much attenuation the signal will experience, how dispersion behaves over distance, and. Visible light wavelengths (400-750nm) are not used for fiber optic transmission due to high attenuation.
